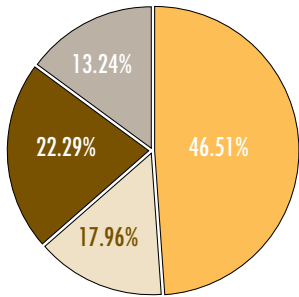

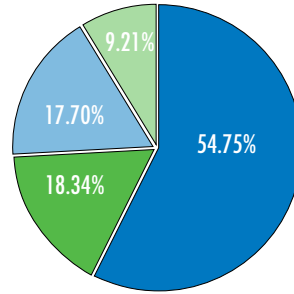

He is responsible for coordinating AT&T's efforts in support of civic, business, and government organizations in the community. Prior to his current position, he served as Sales Director for South Carolina in AT&T's Small Business Sales Division.

A resident of Charlotte for more than nine years, Sanchez has worked as Regional Sales Director for BTI, a competitive local exchange carrier, where he managed the local branch office. Before moving to Charlotte, he served as Executive Vice President and part owner of Kisa Internacional S.A., a telecommunications technology integrator and service provider with main offices in Colombia, South America. In addition, he has owned and operated a local cable station in New York and has produced a weekly travel television program which aired on The Travel Channel and the Telemundo Network for five years.

He received a bachelor's degree in International Relations and Political Science from Florida International University. Community leadership positions include serving on the Board of Directors of the Charlotte Chamber, Arts and Science Council, and the Boy Scouts of America. Previously, Sanchez also served on the CPCC Foundation Board. He is a member of the Board of Advisors at the Institute of Emerging Issues of North Carolina State University and the North Carolina in the World Project at the Center for International Understanding in Chapel Hill, North Carolina. He is active with the Leadership Team Board at Collinswood Bilingual Academy in CMS and was appointed Jury Commissioner for the 26th Judicial District in Mecklenburg County in 2003. He is past chairman of the Latin American Chamber of Commerce and served on the Mayor's Immigration Study Commission in 2006.

**Rich D. Jones** was appointed by Governor Mike Easley to the CPCC Board of Trustees. He serves as Senior Vice President of Enterprise Sourcing, Products and Services at Bank of America in Charlotte. In this capacity, his organization is responsible for supporting Bank of America's sourcing for Marketing, Human Resources, Travel, Corporate Workplace and Corporate Functions such as General Council, Tax, Audit and Treasury. In addition to sourcing, Jones's organization

# CPCC Presents Top Educational Award

## **Stanley Law Receives the Richard H. Hagemeyer Educational Advancement Award**

Ask Stanley Law, YCommunity Vice President for the Dowd YMCA and Stratford Richardson YMCA, what Central Piedmont Community College (CPCC) means to him, and you'll probably hear the words "life changing." Law, a Charlotte native and former student at CPCC, has experienced first-hand how this community college opens doors and improves lives. As a result of Law's success, he received the Richard H. Hagemeyer Educational Advancement Award at CPCC's graduation ceremonies on May 10 at Cricket Arena.

The Hagemeyer Award is named for Dr. Richard H. Hagemeyer, CPCC's founding president and president emeritus. The award is presented to a current or former CPCC student who demonstrates significant benefit from studies at CPCC by:

- Demonstrating community involvement and social responsibility
- Acquiring scholastic and learning skills that have led to continued personal and educational growth
- Improving his or her economic status and potential for growth
- Exemplifying positive and significant life changes

During his senior year at West Charlotte High School, Law wasn't really interested in submitting applications to any colleges or universities. Coming from a family of educators, he was concerned about how this would be received by his family. His grandmother encouraged him to "take a few classes at CPCC to keep his mind sharp." After enrolling in a few classes at CPCC and continuing his day-time job, Law realized the importance of continuing his education. He completed fifteen credit hours at CPCC before transferring to Gardner-Webb University and obtaining a B.A. degree in social science.

Law currently serves as the YCommunity Vice President for the Dowd YMCA and Stratford Richardson YMCA in Charlotte. In this position, he is responsible for the overall vision, direction and full implementation of the Dowd and Stratford Richardson YCommunity. He also serves as the Executive Director of the Dowd YMCA. Law has committed his career to the YMCA profession for more than 17 years in this region.

"CPCC helped me understand the importance of furthering my education beyond high school," states Law. "I am forever grateful for my grandmother's recommendation to keep my mind sharp and to CPCC for helping me get off to a great start. "

In addition to his commitment to the success of the YMCA, Law's passion for helping others has been demonstrated by his service on various boards. Over the years, he has served on the Gardner-Webb University Student YMCA Board of Directors, Mental Health Association Board of Directors, North Carolina Outward Bound Charlotte Committee, Youth Homes, Inc. Board of Directors, Children and Family Service Center Board of Directors, Mecklenburg Partnership for Children (Smart Start), Foundation for the Carolinas Impact Fund, Junior League of Charlotte Advisory Board, and many others.

# CPCC's *Creating Opportunities* Campaign Exceeds Goal and Raises \$28 Million

Mr. Norman went on to say, "CPCC seems to have the formula for success. Take people and give them an education to improve their lives, and that ripples into their family life, their children's lives and future generations. CPCC lessens the huge drain on social services, while simultaneously churning out much-needed skilled workers to strengthen the economy."

"Yet," noted Dr. Tony Zeiss, President of CPCC, "we estimate that, of the people that filled out applications last year, 4,400 had to be turned away because they had no means to pay the \$1,500 tuition. The scholarship dollars raised during the campaign will help us address this situation."

Dr. Zeiss is more than complimentary of the efforts of all concerned. "The generosity and spirit of the people of Charlotte cannot be overstated. We are so grateful for the tireless work of our volunteers, faculty, and staff and for the goodwill that our donors so graciously demonstrated."

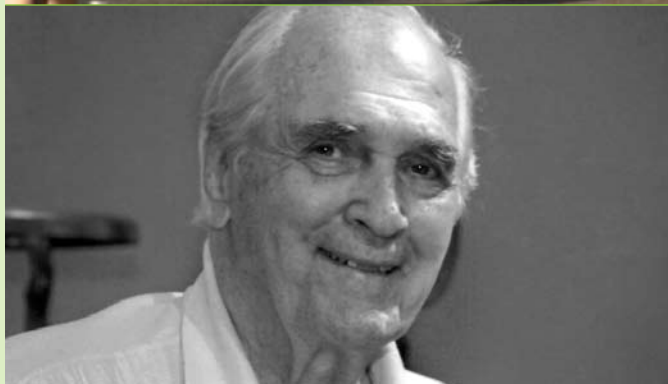


## CPCC Charlotte Skyline Run Sets Record

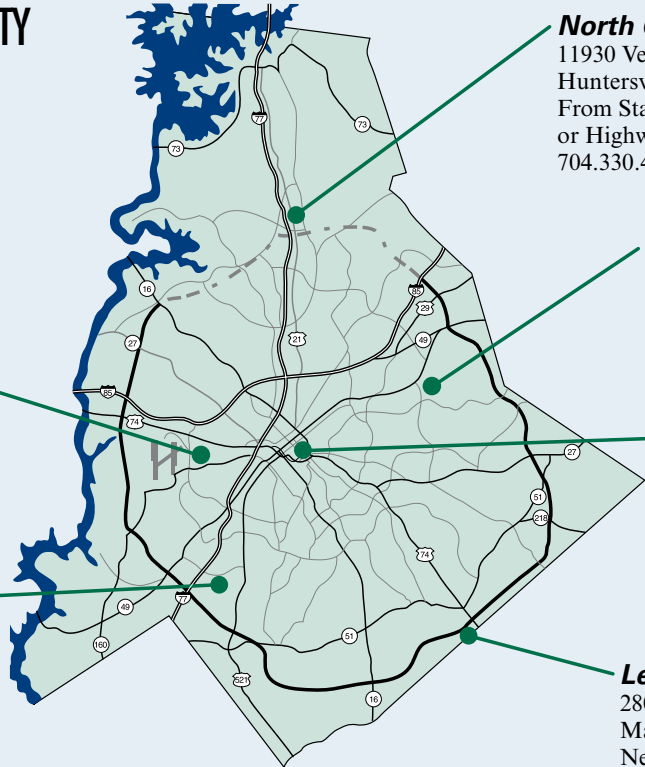
