Letter from the President



Keeping Our Promises to the Community.

Since our College's birth in 1963, we've not only been making promises, but we've also been keeping our promises to this community. From our humble beginning more than 40 years ago, a host of dedicated leaders have built Central Piedmont Community College into an institution that's recognized nationally in workforce development. Today, CPCC serves more than 70,000 people on six campuses. As President of CPCC, I am proud to say that you can look anywhere in Mecklenburg County and see evidence of our work.

Our promise is to keep our doors wide open so that the citizens of Mecklenburg County and their children and grandchildren have access to the knowledge and skills they need to lead productive lives. The demand for our services soars each year. In fact, we regrettably had to turn nearly 2,000 students away due to faculty and space restraints this semester. In addition, more than 4,000 students were eager to receive our services, but did not have the financial resources to attend CPCC. Our goal through the CPCC Foundation's "Creating Opportunities" campaign is to ensure that every needy student who walks through our doors receives the financial support they need to attend our college. Our major fund raising campaign of \$15 million to address some of the College's most pressing needs and priorities has been extremely successful, but we are still \$2 million short of our scholarship endowment goal.

We owe a debt of gratitude to our area legislators and county commissioners for their generous support this past year in economically stressed times. We realize that during tough times, we must seek additional funding sources to continue our momentum and meet the needs our students.

Community and technical colleges continue to grow in value as they address the needs of their communities. In fact, while only 21.5 percent of the nation's jobs require a bachelor's degree or higher, 75 percent require training by community or technical colleges. It's no secret that community colleges throughout the Carolinas are strong economic engines that keep our state moving forward. This region and our nation continue to be challenged by a labor pool that is unskilled and unprepared. CPCC stands ready to face this challenge by offering programs for non-traditional and diverse populations that provide them with the training they need to find meaningful employment. In addition, CPCC programs and services provide citizens with new career opportunities and the chance to advance their skills. Our college transfer programs offer the first two years of education for those who wish to continue their education at a four-year college or university. Our students will testify that our faculty and programs are among the best in the nation.

Over the past year, our College has been noted for its outstanding educational offerings to this community. This annual report highlights a few of our most prestigious awards and honors. I am extremely proud of our outstanding Board of Trustees, CPCC Foundation Directors, the President's Council, faculty, staff and students at CPCC. It's because of their dedication and commitment that our College continues to set the pace in our nation for community colleges.

Letter from the Chairman of the Board

Central Piedmont Community College continues to maintain a reputation of excellence not only in this region, but throughout the state and nation as well. Since its founding, CPCC has served more than 1.4 million citizens in Mecklenburg County, and today is the largest college in the Carolinas, serving more than 70,000 students and program participants and offering more than 10,000 different classes each year. By the year 2015, at its current rate of growth, CPCC is anticipated to serve more than 105,000 students annually.

While these numbers are impressive, the true success of CPCC comes from the individual attention given to each student by the College's outstanding faculty and staff. The dedication and commitment of CPCC's instructors and administrators coupled with top-notch programs and services make the College one of this community's most valuable resources. In any given day in the Charlotte region, you will receive first rate service from CPCC graduates employed as law enforcement officers, automotive technicians, dental and nursing assistants, welders, electricians, computer technicians, hotel managers and in a host of other vocations.

As Chairman of CPCC's Board of Trustees, I have seen first hand the far reaching impact of this institution. The College is widely acknowledged as one of the nation's leaders in workforce development and is continually at the center of new and innovative training initiatives. Whether it's through CPCC's corporate and continuing education program, a two-year associate degree program, a joint venture partnership in geospatial technology, the adult basic education or the English as a

Second Language program, lives are being changed and enhanced through the services of CPCC.

CPCC's outstanding reputation is echoed in recent survey results. Of 830 businesses surveyed, 100 percent of those businesses that hired students trained by the College were satisfied with the services they received and would hire another CPCC student. Ninety-seven percent of workforce students were satisfied with the College's programs and services, and ninety-seven percent of employers were satisfied with the preparation of CPCC graduates to enter the workforce. These ratings reaffirm CPCC's ability to respond to the critical demand for workforce training.

For those interested in the bottom line return on investment to this community, the results are staggering. For every dollar invested in CPCC, the community realizes a \$5.94 return on its investment through expenditures, wages and student financial aid.

I am extremely proud of our community college and the dedication of our President, Board of Trustees, and the entire faculty and staff at CPCC. It is an honor to serve as Chairman of the CPCC Board of Trustees, and I take great pride in being a part of this important educational institution.

Dr. Sue Peck, full-time faculty member in vocational education with Winthrop University, was recently named to the CPCC Board of Trustees. Dr. Peck brings a wealth of knowledge and experience in higher education to the College as well as strong community involvement. Over the past nineteen years, she has served at Winthrop University in the Family and Consumer Sciences and Business Education department as well as Director of Winthrop's Staff Development Collaborative and Student Academic Services. In addition, she served as Assistant Dean in the College of Education and Interim Chair of the Center for Pedagogy.

Her community service and involvement includes service on Charlotte-Mecklenburg School's Bond Oversight Committee and numerous leadership roles at University City Methodist Church.

"We are honored to have Dr. Peck on our Board of Trustees and look forward to the skills and expertise she will bring to the College," states Board of Trustees Chairman Ralph Pitts. "Her experience in higher education and her commitment to this community will be extremely valuable to CPCC."

Highlights of CPCC Achievements

Last year, CPCC awarded 919 degrees, 79 diplomas, 649 certificates, and 251 Adult High School diplomas.

The Association of Community College Trustees Southern Region presented its highest award, The National CEO of the Year, to Dr. Tony Zeiss, president of Central Piedmont Community College.

The American Association of Community Colleges selected CPCC student Jennifer Taylor as the New Century Scholar for the state of North Carolina.

In 2005, the Jack Kent Cooke Foundation selected CPCC student Athena Lapan as one of only 25 national recipients of the most competitive scholarships available to community college students.

CPCC Service Learning Program participants completed 10,000 hours of service to the community involving 32 instructors, 500 students, and 210 community organizations.

The CPCC Foundation provided more than \$7 million in scholarship support through the CPCC Foundation Capital Campaign.

CPCC's scholarship committee awarded more than \$884,000 in scholarships to 1,705 students.

In 2002, the National Alliance of Business named CPCC the Community College of the Year for its response to the workforce and technology needs of local employers and job seekers through innovative educational and training strategies.

CPCC received the Community College National Center for Community Engagement's 2005 Service Learning and Civic Engagement Collaboration Award in the category of K-12 collaboration.

CPCC was recognized for its commitment to diversity with two outstanding awards. The College received the 2005 Public Sector Organization of the Year Award from the Carolinas Minority Supplier Development Council. In addition, CPCC earned the Charlotte Diversity in Business Award from the Charlotte Business Journal in 2004.

CPCC Retention Services received a \$50,000 MetLife Award for enhancing student success.

The Center for Applied Research at CPCC won awards as a result of its work for the Hendrick Automotive Group's fiscal impact on Matthews, and the Pillowtex closing. CPCC served as a collaborative partner with Rowan-Cabarrus Community College on this project and was recognized by the US Department of Labor.

In addition, CPCC received an honorable mention from the U.S. Department of Labor for the "Build Charlotte" program in partnership with the City of Charlotte, Carolinas Associated General Contractors, Charlotte-Mecklenburg Workforce Development Board, and Job Link for unemployed/laid off workers.

- According to the U.S. Department of Labor, only 22% of the nation's jobs require a bachelor's degree or higher. But, 75% of the nation's jobs require training by community or technical colleges.
- Central Piedmont Community College is the largest community college in North Carolina, offering 100 degree and certification programs, customized corporate training, market-focused continuing education, and special interest classes.
- CPCC is academically, financially and geographically accessible to all citizens of Mecklenburg County.
- CPCC serves more than 70,000 people on its six campuses.
- Since its founding, CPCC has served more than 1.4 million citizens in Mecklenburg County.
- CPCC serves more than 3,000 businesses through its corporate and continuing education program.

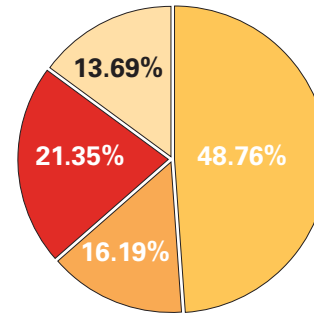

Economic Impact for Year Ending June 30, 2005



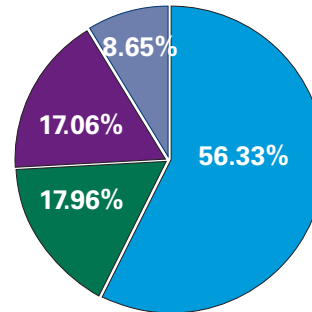

With Their Involvement Comes a Sense of Hope

Central Piedmont is extremely fortunate to have a generous family working with little recognition on the CPCC Foundation's biggest challenge – scholarships for students who wish to attend but lack the financial resources to do so and must acquire assistance. For over a decade, Casey and Anke Mermans and their children, or the Merancas Foundation, have been here for these students.

The Mermans have helped over 3,000 young people receive an education. Mr. Mermans is a successful businessman, and having lived in Holland as well as America, he has seen the European apprenticeship model of workforce preparedness work well over the years. The couple has a strong commitment to CPCC's mission of preparing people for the workforce.

The Mermans' focus has been on the preparation of students for technical careers. This year, their gift was to help recent high school graduates pursuing a two-year degree or a certification that will prepare them for the workforce, for students in our JumpStart Program for displaced workers, and for students in our Pathways to Employment Program for disadvantaged adults – helping them receive basic educational and job skills training. Mr. Mermans says, "It is not necessary to be a white-collar executive to succeed. Blue-collar work is necessary and very noble. It is about being productive citizens."

This family is helping build successful men and women, fairer and more inclusive communities in our region. They are striking proof that hope for students who need financial assistance is alive and well.

We are very grateful to the Mermans. We hope other friends of the College will choose to help with the CPCC Foundation's challenge to raise \$10,000,000 for scholarship assistance by year-end June 30, 2006. As of 2005, \$2.2 million is needed. Together, we can serve as catalysts to prepare students for success in the workplace - for the benefit of all.

Cato Campus Dedicated

On May 19, 2005, CPCC honored Wayland H. Cato, Jr. by naming its Northeast Campus on Grier Road at W. T. Harris Boulevard in his honor. The campus serves more than 4,000 students. The dedication ceremony and luncheon were attended by over 225 people, including Mr. Cato and members of his family, College representatives, and Charlotte-area political and business leaders.

A longtime supporter of CPCC, Mr. Cato's generous gift to name the campus will provide funds for three areas:

1. *The Wayland H. Cato, Jr. Scholarship Endowment*
2. *The Cato Campus Endowment*
3. *A fund to meet emerging needs of the College*

Along with his father, Mr. Cato founded The Cato Corporation which has grown into one of the nation's largest chain of women's clothing stores with more than 1,200 stores in 31 states. In addition to Cato, the

corporation also owns and operates It's a Fashion stores. Mr. Cato's daughter Clarice Cato Goodyear is a member of CPCC's Board of Trustees and the CPCC Foundation Board of Directors. Speaking at the dedication, she said: "Dad believes that the best thing a person can do for himself is to get a good education. CPCC touches 70,000 students per year – an incredible number . . . the entire Cato family is proud to know there will always be a CPCC Cato Campus."

Retired from The Cato Corporation, Mr. Cato now owns and operates a cattle ranch in Wyoming. In recognition of his new venture, the campus dedication had a decidedly western theme complete with horses and singing cowboys.

The College is most grateful to Mr. Cato and the Cato family for their leadership and support.

The Belk Foundation Donates \$500,000 to Name Belk Plaza

The Belk Plaza on Little Sugar Creek Greenway will be an expansive, attractive new park-like area at the corners of Elizabeth Avenue and Kings Drive on CPCC's Central Campus.

For the past several years, significant efforts by the city and county have been aimed at transforming the land bordering Little Sugar Creek into a fifteen-mile urban greenway. CPCC is an active partner in this effort. The ten-year project will result in a unique park that will benefit virtually all areas of the city. It will become an important resource for the Charlotte community in terms of environmental and historical education, recreation, and social and cultural opportunities. College President Dr. Tony Zeiss says, "It is fitting for this important section of the greenway to bear the Belk name. With its public green space and works of art, it will become a focal point for the city and a much-used

amenity for its residents. The Belk Plaza will testify to the commitment of Charlotte's leaders to enrich and preserve the city's natural environment for the benefit of generations to come.

CPCC also has a Belk Building on its Central Campus; and in the year 2000, the Claudia Watkins Belk Center for Justice was opened on the College's Huntersville campus.

Cato and Lea Take Top Honors

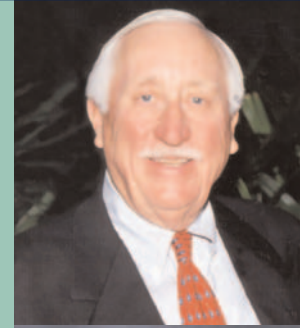

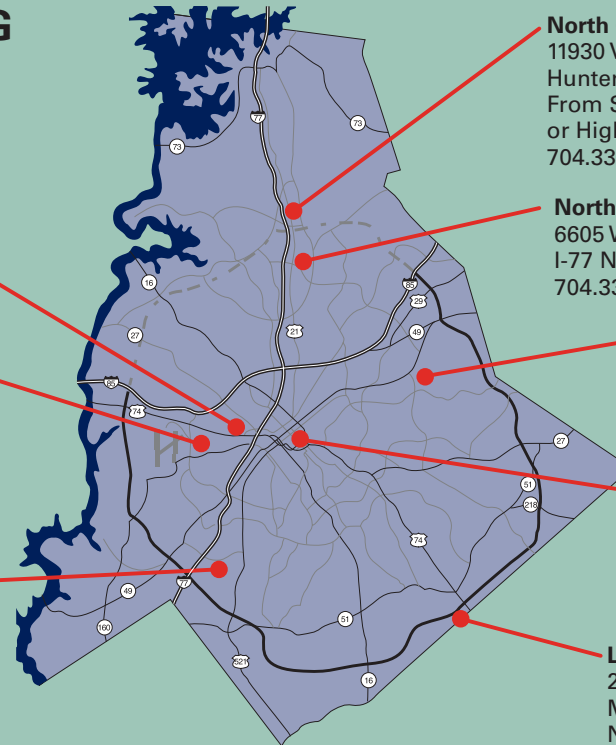
