## Group Orientation for minor GED students

All 16/17 year old students who want to enter the GED program must attend a group orientation with their parent or legal guardian. All Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools students must bring with them a petition for release form signed by the principal from the last school attended along with a NC state issued ID card.

Parents with home school students must present the official home school certification card issued from Raleigh and a NC state issued ID card.

Minor students who attended other public or private schools other than Charlotte-Mecklenburg School system must bring withdrawal information from the last school

attended and a NC state issued ID card.

Those minor students who desire to enter the GED program must call Al Hunter at 704.330.5065 to reserve seats at the orientation. Seating is limited, and all who want to attend must call in advance.

Minor students will not be processed unless a parent or legal guardian accompanies the minor student to the orientation session. Persons other than parents must show proof that they have legal rights to act in the student's behalf.

**NOTE:** Due to limited seating, only the student and parent will be permitted to enter the orientation session.

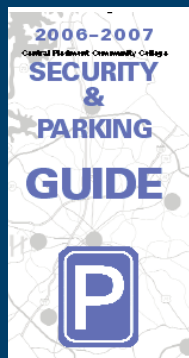
## Parking at CPCC

Due to the popularity of morning classes, parking spaces on Central Campus may be difficult to find between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. You can make the task easier by studying the helpful hints and parking instructions that follow. Parking is usually available on the other campuses at all hours.

### Tips on Parking:

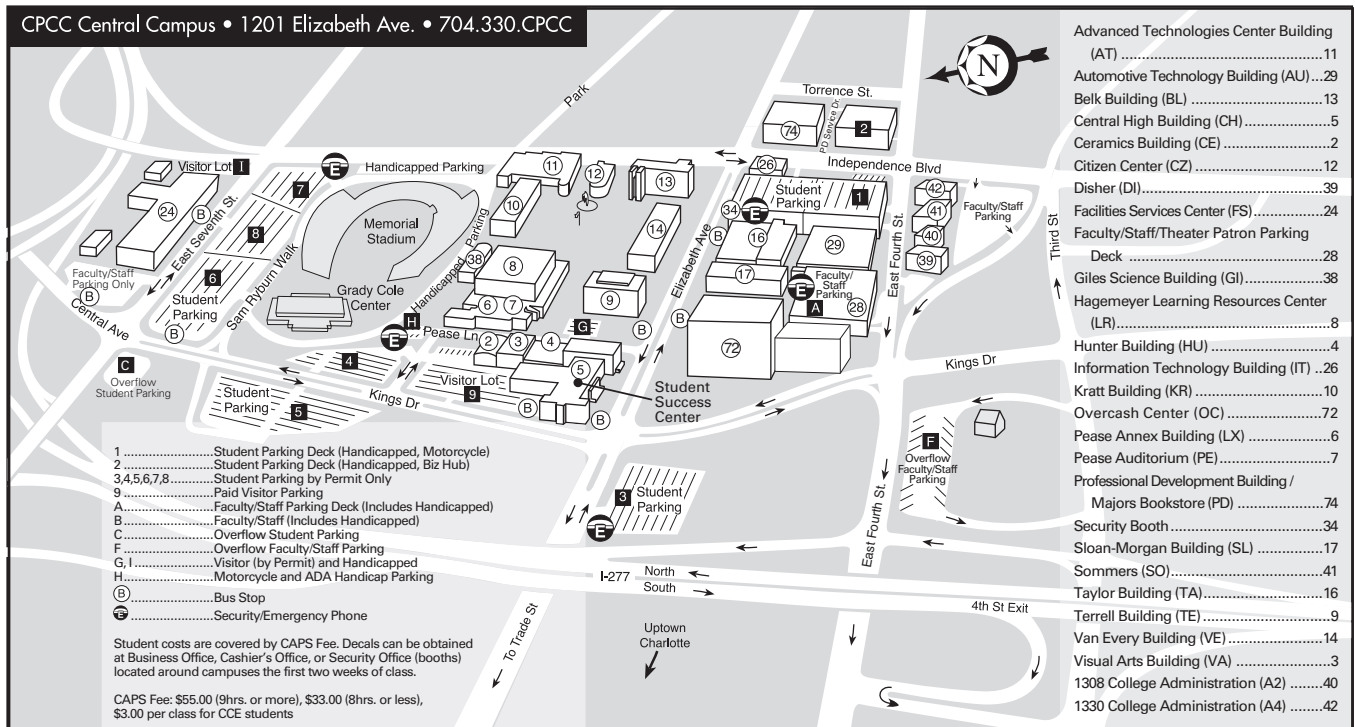
- **Visitor Parking Only:** If you plan to park in Central Campus Lot H, you must be a visitor and not a student presently enrolled.
- Park only within lined spaces in the appropriate—staff or student—lot. Cars improperly parked or blocking other cars may receive a citation, be towed or booted at owner's expense. Any vehicle receiving more than 3 parking citations within a semester/term may be towed or booted at the owner's expense. (Estimated, Tow/\$85, Boot/\$25; towing cost subject to change.)
- Parking in a handicapped parking space without a handicapped placard (permit) is illegal; violators will receive a \$250 citation. If you need a handicapped placard, contact the N.C. Division of Motor Vehicles for an application. Additional Central Campus handicapped access information is available in the office of Disability Services Terrell Building, 2nd floor.
- Parking citations must be paid within 10 days of issue date to avoid penalty. Please see instructions on citation. Send citation appeals to: Central Piedmont Community College, Parking Services Manager, P.O. Box 35009, Charlotte, North Carolina 28235-5009.

## Some Helpful Hints on Parking



- Expect it to become easier to locate a parking space on Central Campus after the first few weeks of class when students have become familiar with streets, lots and the appropriate arrival time. For Central Campus, consider scheduling classes in the early morning or afternoon, or car-pooling or riding the bus. CATS schedules are available in the Student Life Center.
- Many streets surrounding Central Campus are one-way or have medians that restrict turns. Note the location of each parking lot and its best point of access for you. Try to avoid left turns as you choose your options.
- Central Campus new students and visitors may go to the Central Campus Student Success Center in Central High for parking information and directions. On other campuses, get answers to parking questions not answered by this brochure at the information center or bookstore on that campus.
- Take the time to visit our beautiful campuses before the first day of classes. Drive around and locate each parking lot; park and walk around the campus using the map to locate the buildings where your classes are scheduled.
- Arrive on campus early for your classes.

## Compressed Degree Program

If you work full time during the day and want to earn an Associate in Arts (A.A.) degree at night, this is the program for you.

At CPCC, we have designed an evening college program that traditionally takes working adults five years to complete and we have compressed it into just two years.

With CPCC's Compressed Degree Program, you get to keep earning an income during the day while earning a transferable Associate in Arts degree at night in two years or less!

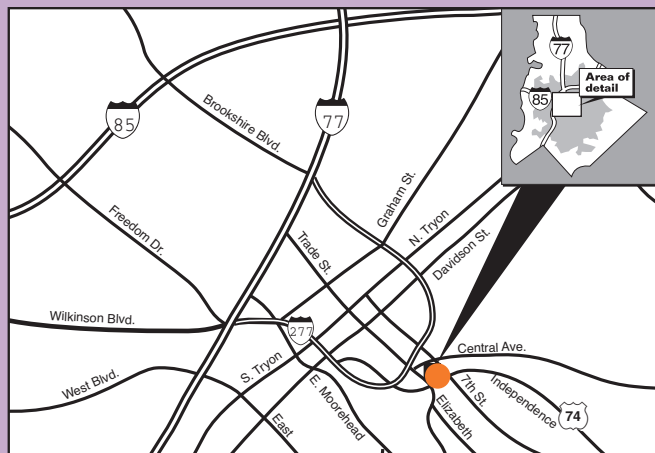
### Highlights:

- Classes are held in the evening in eight-week segments.
- Students carry only two classes at any given time.
- Earn at least 12 hours credit during fall and spring semesters by taking two classes during each eight-week segment of the 16-week semester
- Earn 8 hours credit during the summer term.
- Classes operate on CPCC's published fall, spring, and summer academic schedules.
- Credits earned at other colleges may transfer, allowing you to complete the AA degree in less than two years.
- Advisement is available.
- You need to be a mature student with a will to succeed to participate in this program.
- You must score well on CPCC's entrance test.
- The AA degree will transfer to any state college in North Carolina.

*Please Note: Payment is required the day on which you register. Tuition is controlled by the NC legislature and is subject to change without notice.*

7000 and 8000 — Costs vary per course and are published in the CCE class schedule (No difference in charges for non- resident students).

Exceptions: Students who are 65 years or older and reside in North Carolina pay no tuition. (Excluding self-supporting classes.)

\*Residence requirements are explained with admissions information.

### Technology Fees

There is also a technology fee charge of \$1.00 per credit hour with a maximum of \$16.00 for Curriculum and \$5.00 for Occupational Extension classes that the student is responsible for each semester if they take a class with a lab.

### Student Activity/Publication Fee

- \$10.00 for 1 - 8 credit hours
- \$19.00 for 9 or more credit hours

There is no student activity fee for the summer term.

### Lab Fees

Some classes require a lab fee charge. For those classes with lab fees, the charges are as follows:

- Curriculum - \$14.00 per lab hour
- Maximum lab fees per semester - \$56.00

Note: "Lab Hours" include both lab and clinical hours.

Appropriate lab fee amounts will be refunded if class is cancelled by the College or if the lab fee class is dropped during the period of full tuition refund. Lab fees will be used to provide supplies and equipment in the respective programs.

### Tuition Limit

The most tuition a N.C. resident can pay in a semester is \$632.00. The most an out-of-state resident can pay is \$3,376.00.

## Residence Status for Tuition Purposes

You may be eligible for in-state tuition status if you have established and maintained legal residence in N.C. for 12 consecutive months immediately prior to enrollment.

Students who wish to be classified as in-state residents for tuition purposes may be required to produce substantiating documentation on admission to the College or at the point of registration.

Responsibility for proving status lies with the student. Various proofs and combinations of documents may be reviewed as evidence of your status.

- N.C. driver's license
- N.C. voter registration card
- N.C. tax return
- N.C. vehicle registration
- other proofs such as lease, deed, utility bill

Other types of documents may be reviewed as well, and additional documentation may be requested by the College, if necessary. No one item nor particular combination will necessarily be the determining factor. Simply living in or attending school in North Carolina does not, in itself, establish residence. The decision will be based on your eligibility to establish residence, your length of residence and the weight of the evidence you present.

Non-Citizens: Your immigration document and date of issue are factors in determining residence status. You should bring, in addition to the above types of proofs:

- Your I-551 (green card)
- Visa
- or I-94

If you are changing your immigration status, please bring your most current I.N.S. document or communication (letter, memo, form, etc.) as well.
