



Stimulus Job Training

Thanks to a partnership with the Workforce Development Board (WDB) and monies allocated through federal stimulus money, Central Piedmont Community College (CPCC) has created fast-track job training programs that will help Charlotte’s population complete job training as quickly as possible.

Am I Eligible? Contact WDB

Individuals who have been displaced from employment and those who are unemployed or underemployed may qualify. To determine if you qualify for Workforce Investment Act (WIA) funding under either the Displaced Worker or Adult Services Program, please contact one of the five area Job Links at www.joblinkcenter.org or visit www.cpcc.edu/changingcareers.

Quick and Free

Individuals who are approved for WIA funding will receive a voucher that covers tuition, fees, books and other supplies as required by the specific program. Funding is provided through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act and the JobsNow 12-in-6 programs. All programs listed are designed to be completed in as little as six months. Persons who qualify for WIA funding as a displaced worker or meet the WIA Adult Services Program requirements may take these classes free-of-charge.
