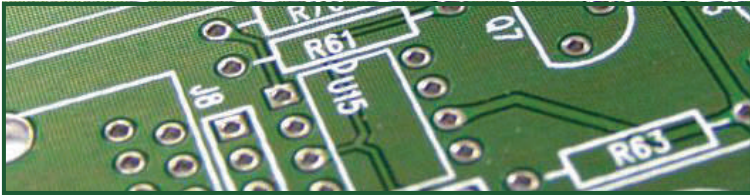

Overview

The Electrical Engineering curriculum prepares students with the coursework required to transfer to the Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. A BSEE degree can lead to careers spanning a broad area in the design, management and development in the fields of power, optoelectronics, digital electronics, analog electronics, artificial intelligence, control systems, signal processing and telecommunications.

Degree Awarded

Students complete the first two years of coursework (listed under Curriculum) at Central Piedmont Community College and transfer to the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. After successfully completing this two-year program (i.e., passing each course with a grade of C or better, and obtaining an overall GPA of 2.5 or better), graduates can join the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering at UNC Charlotte as a junior in the BSEE program. Admissions

- ❖ A high school diploma or equivalent is required. High school students preparing for the BSEE transfer program should complete courses in calculus-based algebra, trigonometry, and advanced mathematics. Skills and proficiencies should be developed in writing, computer literacy, and science.

- ❖ CPCC placement tests are required in English and mathematics. Advancement Studies in mathematics and English courses are available for students to build basic skills and knowledge. A counseling/orientation appointment follows placement testing.
- ❖ Many courses have prerequisites and/or co-requisites; check the Course Descriptions section for details.
