The Interpreter Education curriculum is a lock-step curriculum where courses follow a specific sequence and each group of courses lays the foundation for the next level of courses. Courses must be taken in a particular order and skills must be mastered with a grade of C or better in order to advance to the next level of courses. The total degree credit hours for the AAS in Interpreter Education are 76 credit hours.
