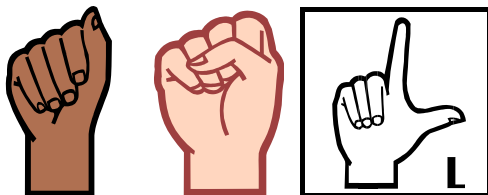

Periodicals:

American Annals of the Deaf: a professional journal dedicated to quality in education and related services for children and adults who are deaf and hard of hearing, founded in 1847 and published by Gallaudet University Press (*currently received at Cato Campus Library*).

Journal of Deaf Studies and Deaf Education: a peer reviewed scholarly journal integrating and coordinating basic and applied research relating to individuals who are deaf, including cultural, cognitive, developmental, linguistic, and educational topics. The *Journal* addresses issues of current and future concern to allied fields, encouraging interdisciplinary discussion promises a forum that is timely, of high quality, and accessible to researchers, educators, and lay audiences (*currently received at Cato Campus Library*).

Sign Language Studies: this journal publishes a wide range of original scholarly articles and essays relevant to signed languages and signing communities, providing a forum for the dissemination of important ideas and opinions concerning these languages and the communities who use them. Topics of interest include linguistics, anthropology, semiotics, Deaf culture, and Deaf history and literature (*currently received at Cato Campus Library*).

Reference Books:

Gallaudet Encyclopedia of Deaf People and Deafness: Published under the sponsorship of Gallaudet College, Washington, DC, the world's only liberal arts college for the deaf, and written by 300 experts from around the world in the fields of sociology, audiology, law, education, psychology, history, and rehabilitation, this unique and authoritative three-volume reference work is broad in scope and international in coverage. It features 271 articles on sign languages and other methods of communication hearing, audiology, and auditory disorders organizations, associations, publications of the deaf community, rehabilitation, demographics, religion, biographies of distinguished deaf individuals, educational programs, and the conditions and status of the deaf community in most of the major countries around the world. This unique encyclopedia meets the needs of both professionals and laypersons for clearly written, comprehensive information about the deaf and hearing impaired. (*Cato Campus Library*)

The National Association of the Deaf is a civil rights advocacy group for the deaf and is involved in educational and professional issues of interest to the hearing impaired.

Videos:

Through Deaf Eyes: Inspired by the "History through deaf eyes" exhibition created by Jack R. Gannon and originally produced as a documentary film for public television in 2007, this two-hour HDTV documentary explores 200 years of Deaf life in America. The film includes interviews with prominent members of the Deaf community, including actress Marlee Matlin and Gallaudet University president emeritus I. King Jordan.

Interwoven throughout the film are six short documentaries produced by Deaf media artists and filmmakers ("Vital signs" by Wayne Betts Jr., an excerpt from "Listen" by Kimby Caplan, "Destination : Eyeth" by Arthur Luhn, "Equilibrium" by Adrean Mangiardi, "That's my marshmallow" by Tracey Salaway, "Audism" by Rene Visco); making-of featurette (2007, 14 min.); interview with filmmaker Lawrence Hott (11 min.); 4 historic films ("Deaf mute girl reciting the 'Star spangled banner'" from 1902, "Preservation of the sign language" by George W. Veitz from 1913, "The Reverend Fletcher Dixie Home for the Deaf" ca. 1935, excerpt from "Beyond silence" from 1962). Poignant, sometimes humorous, these commissioned stories bring a personalized sense of Deaf life in America to the film. Through first person accounts and the film as a whole, **THROUGH DEAF EYES** tells the story of conflicts, prejudice and affirmation that ultimately reaches the heart of what it means to be human.
