Introduction to Interior Design (C30220-C1)

The Introduction to Interior Design Certificate is designed to provide students with a first look into interior design as a potential profession. Students gain hands-on experience in many of the basic skills required to be a successful interior designer. Course work includes principles of design, basic architectural drafting, introduction to interior rendering, and the history of furnishing and interior design. Courses in this program may be transferred directly to the Associate in Applied Science degree program in Interior Design. Careful planning will allow the student to complete this certificate in two semesters.
