Eligibility Requirements

- Students must be at least 18 years of age by the time of clinical.
- **NC State Nurse Aide Candidate Proper Identification** - Candidates are required to bring two (2) forms of current, not expired, official signature-bearing identification (one of which must be photo-bearing) to the test site. One form of identification must be a U.S. government-issued Social Security card, signed and non-laminated. Name and SSN must match what is on the registration record. (pg. 7, *NNAAP Pearson Vue North Carolina Nurse Aide I Candidate Handbook*)
- E-Mail the Nurse Aide Program Assistant, Marcus L. Caldwell (marcus.caldwell@cpcc.edu), once all steps have been completed for permission to register. **Please be sure to include your CPCC student ID number in the e-mail.**
- Once registered must attend a mandatory Nursing orientation
- **Note:** Criminal background checks (CBCs) and drug screens are required by clinical agencies/healthcare systems. If a student is refused access to clinical experiences because of a positive CBC or drug screen, the student will be unable to complete the clinical component of the course. Inability to complete the clinical requirements will result in a failure to progress in the program.
