Victim of Tax-Related Identity Theft

If you filed taxes and believe you are the victim of identity theft, you do not need to be referred to the Identity Protection Specialized Unit (IPSU); you may call the toll-free number (800.908.4490) directly or go to the [ID theft website](#). After the IPSU authenticates your identity, you can request that the IRS mail to the tax filer an alternate paper tax return transcript. The alternate transcript is known as the Transcript Data Base View (TRDBV).

Submit your 2023 Tax Return Database View (TRDBV) issued from the IRS along with this form to the Financial Aid Office

Tax filers may inform the IRS of the tax-related identity theft and obtain a TRDBV transcript by calling the IRS's Identity Protection Specialized Unit (IPSU) at 1.800.908.4490. If you cannot obtain a TRDBV transcript, you may instead submit another official IRS

transcript or equivalent document provided by the IRS if it includes all of the income and tax information required to be verified or a signed copy of the tax return. Unless the institution has reason to suspect the authenticity of the TRDBV transcript or an equivalent document provided by the IRS, a signature or stamp or any other validation from the IRS is not needed.
