

LPN to ADN Option

Associate Degree Nursing (A45110L)

The LPN to ADN transition track is designed to allow currently Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs) to further their education and earn an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN). Graduates of this program are eligible to apply for the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurse (NCLEX RN).

The following courses in the NUR curriculum will be granted credit for experience after successful completion of NUR 223: NUR 111 (Intro to Health Concepts), NUR 112 (Health-Illness Concepts), NUR 114 (Holistic Health Concepts) and NUR 211 (Healthcare Concepts). Competency objectives are met by earning the LPN credential from an accredited institution, by meeting the benchmark ATI PN Comprehensive Predictor score, for having a current LPN licensure issued by the Board of Nursing and for successfully completing NUR 223.
