

Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) Program Pre Admission Guide

Admission to the Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) program is competitive. The program admits 50 students each fall and spring semester. Students must complete a separate admission application when they are ready to apply to the Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) program. It's recommended that students consider all of the following to improve their application

REQUIRED:

1. All applicants must complete a Nurse Aide training program and be listed on the North Carolina registry.
2. It is recommended that the TEAS exam be taken after the General Education courses are completed. For information and/or scheduling for the TEAS, please access <https://www.cpcc.edu/admissions/testing-and-assessment/teas>

OPTIONAL:

1. It is highly recommended that students complete general education courses before applying to the program, *but it is not a requirement*. Many general education courses receive points on the application. The more courses completed, the stronger your application. Once an eligible course is completed with a B grade or better, it will give you points on your application. A recommended course schedule is:
